

## Critical Care Society of Southern Africa

The President, Professor Mervyn Mer, and several council members recently had a fruitful meeting with the national Minister of Health, Dr Aaron Motsoaledi. The Minister listened to a presentation on the goals of the Critical Care Society and stressed the Department of Health's commitment to rebuild academic medicine and strengthen management in the health services, and his support for protocol-driven patient care. A partnership between the Society and the Department of Health will be fostered.

Critical care has received a further boost to its academic profile with the formation of a Department of Critical Care at the University of the Witwatersrand. Professor Guy Richards is head of the new department. The only other universities with critical care departments are the University of the Free State and Medunsa.

The BASIC (Basic Assessment and Support in Intensive Care) course has been introduced to South Africa and two successful courses have been run by the Department of Critical Care at Groote Schuur Hospital. This introduction to intensive care was developed in Hong Kong and Australia and consists of two days of lectures and skill-station demonstrations.
