Certificate in Critical Care

Prevalence of infection in South African intensive care units (PISA) study

The results of this landmark study on infection and antibiotic use in South African intensive care units (ICUs) have finally been published. Many Society members contributed to data collection in ICUs around the country in this one-day prevalence study performed on 16 August 2005. Results showed a high incidence of inappropriate antibiotic use, and a higher mortality associated with inappropriate antibiotic selection. Antibiotics are often administered for too long and not de-escalated when sensitivity results become available. See Paruk F *et al. S Afr Med J* 2012;102(7):613.
